

Deflected Double Weave Cowl Scarf with Layers and Connections

Warp: Bambu 12G, Acorn from Silk City Fibers

18/2 Wool-Silk, Sable, Suede, Copper-D(Dark dye lot), Copper-L (Light dye lot)

Weft: Bambu 12G, Acorn 18/2 Wool-Silk Suede

Wind two warps, one of Wool-Silk and one of Bambu Gradation warp order with 18/2 Wool-Silk:

2 Sable/Sable (Total ends=4)

5 Sable/Suede (Total ends=10)

5 Suede/Copper-D

5 Copper-D/Copper-L

5 Sable/Copper-L

Repeat ***to *** 4X 3 Sable/Sable

Total Wool-Silk ends = 170

Bambu warp: Wind 160 ends

To Warp: Use Profile Draft for threading order.

Start and end with Wool-Silk.

Blocks of 10 Wool-Silk alternate with blocks of 10 Bambu.

To Weave: Use Skeleton Draft tie-up for treadling order.

Treadle 8 picks when using Wool-Silk and 10 picks when using Bambu.

This scarf was woven with two separate layers (Bambu on top) for each end of the scarf. The shoulders were woven in deflected double weave. The center was woven with two separate layers (Wool-Silk on top) for the open cowl section.

Twist fringe on all four layers, handwash gently, hang to dry, press.
